

Come experience nature's beauty in our mountains and valleys. Days spent exploring a land interlinked by the iconic Kettle Valley Rail Trail, Columbia & Western Rail Trail, and Kettle River will leave you feeling grounded. The history of our land will intrigue you with stories shared by friendly locals. Gaze at star-filled skies, play on glistening lakes and adventure down our trails. Listen closely to the sound of Boundary Country calling your name.

Explore the outdoors.

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COMMUNITIES & MOUNTAINS

The communities of Boundary Country are your gateways to adventure. Dive deep into the rich history and fantastical arts that separate our communities from the rest of Canada.

Our largest community is **Grand Forks** with over 4,000 residents. Grand Forks is a hub for quaint cafés, local food artisans, art and music, and historic Doukhobor stories, whose families made the surrounding farmlands their home in the early 1900s.

One of Canada's earliest gold rushes started in the Kettle Valley River, inviting miners to **Rock Creek**. Browse artifacts from the early 19th century at the Kettle River Museum in **Midway**, located on Mile 0 of the Kettle Valley Railway. Discover **Greenwood**'s stories of interesting characters, boom, bust, and the Japanese-Canadian internment. Indulge in activities like water sports and other adventures in **Christina Lake**, where families have vacationed for generations. Camp out, rent a cabin, or stay at a guest ranch in **Beaverdell**, **Westbridge**, the **Christian Valley**, and **Bridesville**.

Winter or Summer, the three ski areas are hubs for your outdoor explorations. **Big White Ski Resort** is Canada's largest ski-in, ski-out resort, with hiking trails and lift-access mountain biking in summer. **Baldy Mountain Resort** is in Canada's top ten highest elevation ski resorts, and **Phoenix Mountain Ski Area** is known as the "Best Little Mountain in BC."


LOCATION

Boundary Country is located midway between Castlegar and Osoyoos, following British Columbia's scenic Crowsnest Highway 3 along the US border. Osoyoos is to the west, with Castlegar and the Kootenay Rockies to the east. Our area can also be accessed by Highway 33 2 hours south beginning from Kelowna.

Entry points from Washington state are Highway 395 at Laurier-Cascade, Highway 21 at Carson-Danville, & Customs Road at Midway-Ferry.

FOLLOW THE RIVERS, TRAILS, AND ROADS TO ADVENTURE

Boundary Country is linked by the Kettle River, the Trans Canada Trail, the Kettle Valley Rail (KVR) Trail, the Columbia & Western Rail (CWR) Trail, the Crowsnest Highway 3, and Highway 33. These timeless landmarks are your guide, connecting you to Canada's pristine wilderness and storied past. From each community, hike and bike on rail trails where trains once chugged. Follow the steps of prospectors on the Dewdney Trail. Journey along forested mountains, sweeping ranchlands, and lush valleys where farmers have worked fertile lands for over a century and a half. Taste the bounty of these fresh flavours at farmers' markets, orchards, dairies, flour mills, and fairs around Boundary Country.

UNCOVER THE STORIED PAST of Boundary Country. People have been attracted to the area for centuries because of the plentiful natural resources and fertile farmlands. Indigenous people, gold and copper-seeking prospectors, Doukhobors, and cattle ranchers were drawn to the area for its abundance. Boundary Country has a legacy of historical, cultural, and heritage experiences that shape the stories told here today.

Kettle River Museum

Kettle River Museum Mile "0" of the Kettle Valley Railway CPR Station House, Caboose & Local History of the Boundary Area # 907, Hwy 3, Midway

UNCOVER THE HISTORY OF BOUNDARY COUNTRY

- Delve into the history and pioneer life at the Kettle River Museum. Explore a furnished CPR Stationhouse and climb aboard a restored CPR caboose. The main museum houses interpretive exhibits including Provincial Police, general store, post office, forestry, and agriculture. The museum is situated at "Mile 0" of the KVR line on the Trans Canada Trail.
- Explore Greenwood's colourful streets with the self-guided walking tour map from the Visitor Centre and Museum.
- Gain an understanding of Doukhobor and Boundary Country heritage with a visit to the Boundary Museum and Interpretive Centre in Grand Forks, housed in an old Doukhobor Schoolhouse.
- Learn about the history of Cascade Falls, which once served as fishing and hunting grounds for many Indigenous people. Walk along the Kettle River to see the remnants of a dam completed in 1902. This was one of the first locations where 3 phase 60 cycle alternating current generators were pioneered using Nikola Tesla's technology.
- Visit the Entwined Trees Park in Midway, home to the Gateway (Stekthal) Learning Circle. It is said the two trees were joined together by Indigenous peoples as a sign of friendship and connection.
- Immerse yourself in a historic mine and admire genuine mining artifacts at Abandoned Mine Museum at the Yankee Boy Mine near Grand Forks. Learn more at exploring abandoned mines.com.
- Relive the gold rush by panning for gold in the Kettle River Recreation Area near Rock Creek
- Learn of Greenwood's history as the first WWII internment site, becoming the home for 1,200 Japanese Canadians. Visit the **Nikkei Legacy Park** to witness the legacies left behind by the families. View the commemorative plaques at the Greenwood Museum and Nikkei Legacy Park

HISTORY LIVES ON

Journey back in time and explore the rich heritage of Boundary Country. The stories and legacies live on today in museums, where an abundance of artifacts bring light to the past. Friendly and knowledgeable staff are onsite to provide additional information and tours.

Discover Greenwood's colourful history at the Greenwood Museum, where you'll learn of the infamous American outlaw, John Jarrett, buried in the Greenwood cemetery. Across the highway from the Greenwood Museum is the Nikkei Legacy Park, a tribute to the Japanese Canadians who were relocated to Greenwood during the WWII Internment.

Located at Mile 0 of the Kettle Valley Railway, the Kettle River Museum in Midway is home to the original Station House. Climb aboard and explore a restored Canadian Pacific Railway caboose or stay the night in

BRIDESVILLE

- an authentic bunkhouse. Learn about the Treaty of 1846 that set the 49th parallel as the Canada/USA border.
- The Boundary Museum & Interpretive Centre is located in the historic Fructova School in Grand Forks, showcasing an extensive collection of artifacts from the turn of the century, reflecting the simple country life of the region's roots, culture, and industry. Visitors can also enjoy the school's open picnic field and stunning valley views.
- The Son Ranch Logging & Chainsaw Museum outside of Grand Forks chronicles the forestry history in the Boundary/Kootenay region through a collection of antique saws, logging equipment, and educational displays in an old homestead timber frame barn. Learn about life in a working forest, then take time to relax in calming wildflower gardens.

OUR COMMUNITIES & MOUNTAINS



BALDY MOUNTAIN RESORT

Baldy Mountain Resort ranks in the top ten of highest elevation ski resorts in Canada. This hidden gem is perfect for family-friendly skiing and snowboarding, with 80% beginner/intermediate terrain and affordable lift ticket prices. Access the 500 skiable acres from two chairlifts. Glide over groomed runs or explore the perfectly spaced glades. Walk through the woods on snowshoes or cross-country ski over 5 km (3 mi) of groomed trails. Grab a bite to eat at the Corduroy Café or enjoy live entertainment in the Baldy Bar. Accommodations are available on the mountain or 35 minutes away in Rock Creek and Bridesville.

BEAVERDELL & CARMI

Beaverdell and Carmi are your basecamps for hiking and biking along The Trans Canada Trail. The 200+ residents will share stories of this once-bustling historic town and what remains of Carmi after the mining glory days. Originally called Beaverton, silver was discovered in 1897 and mined until 1987. Stay the night in a cabin or unplug and rejuvenate at a campsite along the Kettle River. Check out the old-fashioned Beaverdell General Store, founded in 1904, or the Red Rock Garage. This unique town is located on Highway 33, 51 km (31 mi) north of Rock Creek and 78 km (51 mi) from Kelowna.

BIG WHITE SKI RESORT

Boundary Country's largest mountain resort, Big White, is Canada's largest ski-in, ski-out village. Dine at a multitude of world-class restaurants, and choose from a full calendar of family-friendly events.

In winter, head up for fun with the snow ghosts, riding deep Okanagan champagne powder on 2,800 acres accessed from 16 lifts. The resort also offers 25 km (16 mi) of cross-country ski and snowshoe trails, tubing, dog sledding, snowmobiling, horse-drawn sleigh rides, and Canada's highest elevation skating rink. In summer, hike the lush alpine meadows starting from the village or the top of the chairlift. Feel the rush and excitement of mountain biking at the lift-serviced bike park. Stay at a hotel, vacation rental, luxury cabin, or hostel. Big White is 56 km (35 mi) from the Kelowna Airport via HWY 33 from Kelowna or north from HWY 3.

WESTBRIDGE

Lush green forests and open meadows surround Westbridge, making for a perfect picnic spot or basecamp for outdoor adventures. In the spring, take in the colourful wildflowers waving in the winds. Visit in the summer to hike, bike, or ride horses to your heart's content. Come back in the fall to experience the vibrant yellows of larch trees and deep red poplar leaves. Keep an eye out for animals grazing along the roads, such as bears, deer, and moose. Camping is available at several parks in the area, as well as a guest ranch, cabin, and hostel. Westbridge is a small, unincorporated area just 13.5 km (8.4 mi) north of Rock Creek and 35 km (22 mi) south of Beaverdell on Highway 33.

CHRISTIAN VALLEY

Find yourself surrounded by nothing but nature in the Christian Valley. Stay at a remote B&B, cabin, or guest ranch. Pitch your tent along the Kettle River or a secluded recreation site. Stock up on supplies at the Double E Sportsman's General Storee. Access the Christian Valley via Westbridge on Highway 33, then head northeast on Christian Valley Road.

BRIDESVILLE

Gaze out at the tranquil mountain scenery and ranchlands surrounding Bridesville. Stay at a B&B, RV park or guest ranch surrounded by rich agricultural lands, wild birdlife, rolling hills, and pristine mountain views. Bridesville is on HWY 3, 15 km (9 mi) west of Rock Creek and 36 km (22 mi) east of Osoyoos.

ROCK CREEK

Listen for the distant echo of the gold rush days in Rock Creek. In 1859, thousands of miners created a rollicking frontier town, bolstered by tales of gold and riches. Today, the once raucous town has a different claim to fame: a wealth of outdoor recreation that keeps people coming back time and time again.

Hike, bike, horseback ride, snowshoe, or cross-country ski on the Kettle Valley Rail Trail with the scent of summer bunchgrass. Bring your fishing gear and see what's biting in the Kettle River (catch and release only) Rock Creek, and Conkle Lake, with plenty of craggy shorelines where you can drop a line. Upstream you'll find one of Boundary Country's best swimming and paddling holes at the Kettle River Recreation Area.

Check out the Rock Creek Visitor Information Centre located inside the Riverside Centre to learn about the area. Get a taste of small-batch roasted fair trade coffee or a bite to eat at the Rock Creek Trading Post, built in 1880. Come in autumn to experience old-fashioned countryside fun at the Fall Fair. Stay at a motel, B&B, hostel, or pitch your tent beside the river, beneath towering Ponderosa pines and fall asleep under the stars. Rock Creek is at the junction of Crowsnest Highway 3 and Highway 33.








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VILLAGE OF MIDWAY



The peaceful Village of Midway is located in the Heart of the Kettle Valley and is one of the great places to visit in Boundary Country with many historical sites, numerous recreational opportunities, and attractions. A natural unspoiled environment and friendly people await you in our sunny community.

Discover Mile 0 of the Kettle Valley Rail Trail, explore our hidden network of hiking and biking trails, and enjoy riverside camping along the scenic Kettle River. We invite you to discover Midway for yourself!





VILLAGE OF MIDWAY

Discover the sweetness of village life in the Village of Midway (pop. 600+), where the charm will invite you to linger. Walk or bike the Trans Canada Trail from Mile 0 of the Kettle Valley Rail Trail at the Kettle River Museum. Railway wars and prospector dreams live on through storytellers, who will share the significance of historical artifacts. Recount stories of your adventures with fellow travellers in the converted bunkhouse accommodations.

In 2010 the Olympic Torch stopped at the Entwined Trees Park, a symbol of connection and friendship, created by the region's Indigenous people. Settle down for the night at the Mile Zero motel, in the converted bunkhouse at the Kettle River Museum, an RV park, or camped out on the riverfront. As the halfway point between the Rocky Mountains and the Pacific Ocean, just north of the US-Canada border, Midway is a natural stopping point on HWY 3 and The Trans Canada Trail,

located east of Rock Creek and west of Greenwood.

PHOENIX MOUNTAIN SKI AREA

Phoenix Mountain Ski Area is the local ski and board destination for winter enthusiasts. Operating for over 50 years, Phoenix has become known as the "Best Little Mountain in BC" because of the terrain well-suited for families and beginners. Runs for all skill levels can be accessed by the T-bar, with 15 runs over 244 metres (800 ft). The day lodge and restaurant have a welcoming and charming atmosphere. There's occasionally free night skiing. Venture out to Marshall Lake for groomed Nordic ski trails and great mountain biking and hiking trails in the warmer months.

There are no on-hill accommodations, so visitors stay nearby in Greenwood (9 km / 5.7 mi) or Grand Forks (28 km / 14 mi).

GREENWOOD

Tucked into a narrow valley beneath Jubilee Mountain lies Greenwood, Canada's smallest city. Once a bustling community of 3,000 people built around a copper mining operation, today's population is around 700. Learn about the 60 colourful heritage buildings with the self-guided walking tour map from the Greenwood Museum & Visitor Centre. Listen to the tales of the mining boom to bust and eventual revitalization during the days of WWII. Visit the Nikkei Legacy Park, created in recognition of the Japanese Canadian internment in Greenwood during World War II, a dark chapter in Canadian history.

Drop into local favourites for a bite to eat, like the Deadwood Junction café, Two Cowboys HQ, or the Copper Eagle Cappuccino & Bakery, which was the filming location for the Oscarnominated movie "Snow Falling On Cedars." After a day on the Columbia & Western Rail (CWR) Trail or hiking the mountain trails, settle in for the night at a campsite or roadside motel.

Greenwood is located on the Trans Canada Trail Trail and Hwy 3 between Midway and Grand Forks.

GRAND FORKS

Grand Forks (pop. 4,000+) is Boundary Country's largest service centre, nestled in a lush, broad valley flanked by mountains and rolling farmlands. The Trans Canada Trail, Kettle River and Granby Rivers converge here, inviting outdoor adventure in every season. Grand Forks has a paved section of the Columbia & Western Rail Trail. Check out the lesser-known rock climbing scene around town or do some indoor bouldering at the Fresh Tracks Outdoors Club.

This resilient community welcomes you to the downtown core, where local shops and eateries, heritage sites, and cultural attractions are waiting to be explored. The timeless architecture invites a stroll along galleries, shops, and murals that anchor a vibrant arts scene. Gallery 2 is Boundary Country's regional art gallery, home to contemporary art exhibitions, an artisanal gift shop, and Visitor Centre. Celebrate the stories of farmers, prospectors, and Doukhobors at the local museums.

Grand Forks offers many tasty food choices, from family-run operations to familiar fast-food chains. Taste bountiful local flavours like homemade delights at The Wooden Spoon and delicious Doukhobor cuisine at The Borscht Bowl. After a long drive, take the kids to The Board Room Café, featuring a game library of 100+ titles. Grand Forks is 97 km (60 mi) from Castlegar and the West Kootenay Regional Airport, on the CWR Trail between Christina Lake and Greenwood.

CHRISTINA LAKE

Spend the day relaxing or exploring in the charming community of Christina Lake (pop. 1,400), where families have vacationed for generations. Time is unhurried in this home-away-from-home. Dive into Canada's warmest tree-lined lake and play along 45 km (28 mi) of storybook shoreline. Breathe in the fresh air of the Monashee Mountains, where forested slopes meet with wide sandy beaches. It's here where the historic Columbia & Western Rail Trail and Dewdney Trails merge, enticing you to explore the outdoors.


Browse the local galleries, shops, and markets for locally produced items. Taste local cuisine at cafés and restaurants. Cool off with a scoop of ice cream. Stop into the Christina Lake Welcome Centre for visitor information, a photo op with the 3D railway mural, or to walk along the lakefront nature trail. While there, pick up a fresh-baked treat from the café.

Summer days revolve around the water and mountains, with endless ways to have fun. Spread your beach blanket in a secluded cove or on a broad, sandy beach. Play a round of golf or a game of pickleball in the Official Pickleball Capital of Canada. There's lots of water fun, fishing, hiking, and biking in the area. Visit the marina for a full range of water sports rentals and activities.

In the winter, the trails beckon to be explored by Nordic ski, snowshoe, or fat-bike. Snowmobiling is popular on designated trails. Let the chilly temperatures and snowy vistas inspire your hand to create works of art as it does for the local artisans. Find bliss in a cozy cabin tucked away from the world.

Christina Lake is part of the region inhabited by the Sinixt First Nation, known as the Arrow Lakes People, an Interior Salish people whose territory stretched roughly from the Monashee Mountains to Kootenay Lake, from Revelstoke to northeast Washington. Age-old pictographs can be found along the northeast lakeshore evidence of these first inhabitants, offering a glimpse into the past.

Christina Lake is on HWY 3, 22 km (14 mi) from Grand Forks, and 77 km (48 mi) from Castlegar and the West Kootenay Regional Airport.



Swim, paddle, and fish along rivers and lakes all spring & summer long. The vistas shift to warm, vibrant colours in autumn. Come winter, bundle up and get outdoors to play in the snow in the cool light.



GOLF COURSES

Take a swing on one of three golf courses. The Christina Lake Golf Club, designed by Les Furbur, is known as one of BC's top courses. This 18-hole course has unique black sand traps. Neighbouring it is the 9-hole Cascade Par 3 Golf Course. This course is a walk in the park, with large greens, water hazards, and bunkers. Cascade also offers a disc golf course and glow-in-the-dark golf nights. For another 9-holes, check out the Kettle Valley Golf Course between Rock Creek and Midway, which has been in operation for over 90 years, making it the longest continually operating golf club in the province.

DISCOVER ANCIENT PICTOGRAPHS

As you glide along the north end of Christina Lake by paddle or boat, look for the ancient pictographs created by Indigenous people long ago. Learn more about them and the area in the Christina Lake Welcome Centre.

FLOAT THE DAY AWAY **ON OUR LAKES & RIVERS**

Paddle across shimmering lakes and gentle rivers on a stand-up paddleboard, canoe, or kayak. Cast a line and wait for the fish to bite. Speed away in style on a pontoon boat, speed boat, or personal watercraft. Glide along Christina Lake's 18 km (11 mi) forested shoreline. Listen to the call of loons on Jewel Lake, where the maximum 10 hp boating restriction makes for peaceful paddles. Or explore the many smaller lakes in the area.

You can bring your watercraft or rent one from a water sports provider in the area.

MOUNTAIN BIKING

Pedal along ribbons of trails, traverse rugged terrain and climb hills to scenic alpine views. Boundary Country has many biking trails for all levels, notably around Christina Lake and Grand Forks. Sharpen your skills at Big White Resort, with 25 world-class lift-accessible mountain biking trails, beginner skills area, pump track, slopestyle centre, and bike school.

BIRD WATCHING

The Boundary Country is home to various wildlife, many of which are feathered. With grand open spaces and many community initiatives to protect natural habitats, it's a great place to spot woodpeckers, quails, bald eagles and more. You never know what you might find when walking the trails or sitting on a restaurant patio. Enjoy local photography and learn more in the Boundary Bird Brochure at the Rock Creek Visitor Information Centre.



HIKING AND BIKING TRAILS

Hike and bike along the Kettle Valley Rail Trail, a 202 km (125 mi) journey through Boundary Country, part of the Trans Canada Trail, which connects Canada from coast to coast to coast. Follow the KVR-TCT as it travels from the Paulson to McCulloch, through our Boundary communities. Discover nature and travel the rails to trails.

Discover the railway history at the Kettle River Museum in Midway, where Mile 0 of the Kettle Valley Railway (KVR) joins with the Columbia & Western Railway (CWR). The KVR ran from Hope to Midway, and the Columbia and Western Railway came from Castlegar. Big White Ski Resort has trails from the village and chairlift to stunning mountain views and alpine meadows blanketed by native wildflowers. There is a myriad of trails weaving through the region, making for unique adventures year after year. For a full map of hiking and cycling trails in the Boundary Country, pick up a Trail Map at a local tour operator or Visitor Centre.

PARKS

Discover provincial, regional, and community parks in beautiful locales throughout Boundary Country. Bask in the quiet of the wilderness, surrounded by mountain peaks, cascading waterfalls, sweeping grasslands, and sun-drenched beaches. Take time to unwind and reconnect with the natural world in Boundary Country's protected places, where wildlife makes their homes. You may glimpse bighorn sheep, elk, deer, and birds as you hike and bike. The tranquil lakes and slow-running rivers are home to many types of fish, like rainbow and brook trout. Visit our parks, listed from west to east:

CONKLE LAKE PROVINCIAL PARK


Soak up the tranquillity of this secluded non-motorized 3 km (1.8 mi) long lake, enjoying well-deserved peace and quiet. Windsurfing, paddling, and great fishing draw people here. There are 34 campsites for quality front-country camping, best accessed from Hwy 3 via Rock Creek and Bridesville.

KETTLE RIVER RECREATION AREA

A popular destination in all four seasons, the Kettle Valley Rail Trail runs through the park, leading to fantastic hiking and biking. Pan for gold in the river or watch the water flow as you eat a picnic made of local ingredients. Test your skills at the bike park, float down the river, or just enjoy the incredible setting. In the winter, head out on cross-country skiing or snowshoeing trails. There are 34 campsites for quality wilderness camping, *best accessed from Hwy 3 via Rock Creek and Bridesville*.

JOHNSTONE CREEK PROVINCIAL PARK

Reconnect with nature at this small forested campground with trails leading up to three benches. Climb up to view the surrounding ravines and gorges, an excellent viewpoint to spot wildlife from afar. 16 campsites are available first-come, first-served. *Located 10 minutes from Rock Creek*.

BOUNDARY CREEK PROVINCIAL PARK

A tranquil place in the shadow of a copper smelter abandoned in 1918. Stop for a picnic on your ride along the Trans Canada Trail to or from Greenwood, or drop a fishing line in Boundary Creek. There are 17 campsites to enjoy. *Located on the Crowsnest highway just outside of Greenwood*.

JEWEL LAKE PROVINCIAL PARK

Pick a season, sun or snow, and head to this tranquil 3 km (1.8 mi) low horsepower lake. Find peace walking along beachside trails, fly-fishing, and swimming in the warmer months. Jewel Lake Resort on the south end offers basic essentials, boat rentals, and fishing supplies. In winter, try your hand at ice fishing or go Nordic skiing and snowshoeing along forested trails. Get in touch with nature in a cabin stay, or one of 26 campsites available first-come, first-served, with wheelchair-accessible bathrooms. *Located near Greenwood*.

GRANBY PROVINCIAL PARK

Venture to the rugged, raw, and vast wilderness. Adventures here are as varied as the landscape itself. Find yourself in the shadow of old-growth forests, gazing in deep appreciation of the alpine meadows and one of the last intact watersheds in the Southern Interior. Hike, bike, or saddle up and ride trails once used by stagecoaches. There are no vehicle-accessible campsites or clean drinking water sources. Be prepared for wildlife encounters, including grizzly bears. Access the park via North Fork Road from Grand Forks, with the road ending 4 km (2.5 mi) before the park boundary.

BLUEJOINT CREEK RECREATION SITE

This recreation site has a semi-open campsite, ideal for group camping. Bluejoint serves as a staging area and accesses a network of ATV trails. Check with the Grand Forks Visitor Centre for road conditions. *Located approximately 12 km (7.5 mi) north of Grand Forks, the camp is accessed from Granby Road and forest service roads.*

PARKS


BOOTHMAN'S OXBOW PROVINCIAL PARK

Hike or cycle on the trail to the centre of this peaceful park for a view of the oxbow, elk, and deer grazing on the lush grasses. Head down to the Kettle River to swim, paddle, picnic, or cast a line. This park does not permit overnight camping. Located near the Trans Canada Trail, between Grand Forks and Christina Lake.

GILPIN GRASSLANDS PROVINCIAL PARK

Hike or bike trails through rolling grasslands speckled with wildflowers. The park was formed to protect a distinct ecosystem, preserving the home of vulnerable wildlife species. Watch for bighorn sheep, elk, and deer roaming over the fields. This park does not permit overnight camping, and motorized vehicles are prohibited. Located between Grand Forks and Christina Lake.





Bask in the sunshine on a golden beach lining the shallows of Canada's warmest tree-lined lake. Swim, paddle, picnic, and fish all summer long. In winter, come back for Nordic skiing and snowshoeing. This is a popular day-use area with over 40 picnic tables and no overnight camping. Christina Lake is accessible to mobility challenged community members and guests. The provincial beach has wheelchair accessible restrooms as well as 92ft of mobi-mat rolled out over the sand to provide a stable surface for those to access the water. There is also a mobi-chair, a floating wheel chair, that all may sign-out with a care provider at the visitor information centre June through the end of September. Located at the south end of Christina Lake.

Journey to a tranquil respite from today's busy world and find yourself surrounded by old-growth forests, wide-open spaces, and secluded lakes. Christina Lake is perfect for swimming, paddling, waterskiing, and boating. There are 62 sites, including reservable sites at the popular Texas Creek Campground, boat access sites, and backcountry locations. Some facilities in the park are wheelchair-accessible. Located north of Christina Lake.

There are several community parks in Boundary Country, each with a unique charm. Explore the great slag heaps and Hell's Bells at Lotzkar Memorial Park in Greenwood. Have a picnic and let the kids play in the playground at Lion's Park or recognize the history of Japanese-Canadian internment in Greenwood at the Nikkei Legacy Park.

Take an evening stroll along Midway's Riverfront Park, where camping is available in a serene setting on the river with amenities nearby. The Grand Forks City Park beside the river has a spray park, playground, BMX track, and campground. Sway along to Music in the Park at Grand Forks' Gyro Park on Wednesday nights in summer.

Christina Lake has a Community Nature Park with lakeside trails, accessed from the Christina Lake Welcome Centre. Soon to be added early summer 2024 is a dog park for your furry friends to stretch their legs safely and securely. The community has baseball diamonds, children's play and Bike Pump Park, tennis courts, outdoor exercise parks, and pickleball courts with tournaments throughout the year.

THE TRANS CANADA TRAIL

The Kettle Valley Rail (KVR) Trail and Columbia & Western Rail (CWR) Trail join in Midway to form a 240 km (149 mi) section of the Trans Canada Trail, which connects communities throughout Canada to form the world's longest recreational trail. This immersive experience is a hidden gem waiting to be discovered. From rugged mountain passes to tranquil river valleys, the KVR and CWR trails sweep across a vast and ever-changing landscape. Tranquil river shores blend with grassland habitat, ranchlands, mountains, and communities. As you hike or bike along the trails, diverse natural beauty invigorates your senses.

Follow the rail trails to the rural communities of Boundary Country, where you can explore farm flavours, folklore, and local pastimes combined with Indigenous culture, railway history, and breathtaking natural beauty.

Take a day trip or spend the night camping under the stars. There are accommodations in communities and campgrounds along the way.

TRAIL OVERVIEW

The KVR and CWR trails offer a myriad of experiences for explorers of all ages and abilities. As former railways, steep inclines are virtually non-existent so the difficulty level varies by the length of your journey. The Trans Canada Trail in Boundary Country is on the KVR Trail east of Myra Canyon near Kelowna. Follow the KVR to Hydraulic Lake and McCulloch Reservoir, cross the FS 201 Road, and then downhill into Boundary Country. Following the West Kettle River through Carmi and Beaverdell. Near Westbridge, the West Kettle joins the Kettle River. Follow the flow to Mile 0 of the Kettle Valley Railway in Midway, where the KVR ends and the CWR begins. The trail continues on, climbing gradually to Greenwood. Continue through Grand Forks on the Kettle River Heritage Trail, with a 5 km (3 mi) paved section followed by a well-maintained section suitable for thin tires, to Cascade near Christina Lake. The remaining section follows the Kettle River east to Christina Lake, and on to Castlegar.

BE PREPARED

Prepare yourself for a long ride in a remote region with limited cell phone service in some areas. Trail conditions vary, with washboard sections and deep sand. Sturdy bikes, mountain bike tires, and gloves are recommended. Helmets are mandatory in BC. Visit the nearest Visitor Centre for up to date trail information and pick up the Boundary Country Trail Map.

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

HIKING & BIKING TRAILS

Over 1,000 km (620 mi) of all types of trails link communities from Christina Lake to Beaverdell. Choose from a rigorous workout or a gentle stroll. Explore the communities on a multi-day ride or gather the kids for an after-dinner walk along the river. Head to the hills for steep inclines or follow the rail trails over flat valley bottoms. Time spent outdoors will lift your spirit and energize your mind. Just ask any local, and they'll be happy to point you in the right direction.

Tour operators and local retailers offer bikes and equipment rentals.

For information on routes, tours, and shuttles visit BoundaryBC.com/Trails, or check in with the nearest Visitor Centre and pick up your Boundary Country Trail Map.

WATERFALLS & VIEWPOINTS

- The Riverwalk Trail in Midway follows the Kettle River with virtually no gradient. To gain some altitude, cross the river to the Village View Walk and follow the trail to the flag above the Village. Climb to the border marker at the top.
- The stunning Cascade Falls is a 31 m (100ft) waterfall that was once a meeting place and trading ground for Indigenous people and a great source for fishing. Until 1919, a state-of-the-art hydro project was built here, with one of the very first locations to pioneer 3-phase 60-cycle alternating current generators. This technology was based on Nikola Tesla's revolutionary model of alternating current, and it's said this project finally settled a rivalry between Nikola Tesla and Thomas Edison in the AC/DC debate. Today the remnants of the old plant remain in this beautiful area. Located south of Christina Lake, just north of the Canada/USA border.
- Follow your ears towards Fisherman Creek Falls and venture onto the Fisherman Creek Tunnel and old railway bunkhouse. Located not far from Grand Forks, off the North Fork Trail.

HORSEBACK RIDING ADVENTURES

This is cowboy country, where some of the best views are from high in the saddle! Take in the timeless landscapes while riding atop your horse, winding through valleys along riverbanks, and past Ponderosa pine, spruce, and fir forests. Working ranches dot the area, and several offer guided trail rides. There are boundless trails to discover as you ride by the Kettle River and across rolling ranges of native bunchgrass and wildflower-strewn meadows.

When temperatures start to rise, hit the water! Summer months see an average temperature of 30°C in parts of Boundary Country, Luckily, there's plenty of room to play and relax at Christina Lake, which stretches 19 km (12 mi) from tip to tip. Gather the family and spend the day relaxing on the beach and enjoying a picnic lunch. Get out on the water and feel the rush of water skiing, jet-skiing, tubing, and wakeboarding. When everyone is played out, watch the sunset from the bow of your boat. Marina and adventure sports businesses offer boat and watersport rentals to suit your needs.

Remember to pack out what you bring in and help protect our land and water. Ensure your watercrafts—including canoes and kayaks—are inspected and free of invasive mussels. Leave no trace.

TOP PADDLING SPOTS

There's some major paddling to be done along the shores of rivers and lakes throughout Boundary Country. Here are some of the top spots:

- Jewel Lake, outside of Greenwood, is a motor restricted lake (10 hp max) where you crannies.
- Paddle the Kettle River from Westbridge.
- The Granby River in the spring calls for expert kayakers to navigate the rapids at the Staircase and S-Curves. Feel the spray on your face as your heart races.
- For waters as gentle as the breeze, paddle the lower reaches of the Granby and Kettle Rivers.
- Paddle on Christina Lake to ancient pictographs painted on cliff walls by the region's Indigenous people.

In the splendour and freshness of this winter wonderland, you'll find an abundance of outdoor recreation on three mountain ski areas, as well as snow-covered trails and frozen lakes from valley bottom to mountain top. Follow winter's call to explore the great outdoors and experience the restorative power of connecting with nature in **Boundary Country.**

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
SNOW MUCH FUN: ski, snowshoe, snowmobile, skate, fat bike, or dogsled your way through the vast outdoors. Head up to one of three ski hills for some serious fun in the Okanagan champagne powder: Big White Ski Resort, Baldy Mountain Resort, and Phoenix Mountain Ski Area. Explore snow-covered lands, following the Kettle Valley Rail (KVR) Trail, the Columbia & Western Rail (CWR) Trail, and many other community trails. Sled the snowy alpine bowls near the Paulson Summit or ice fish the frozen Jewel Lake.

Christina Lake's Winterfest in January has people jumping in the lake while others cheer from the shore, sipping hot cocoa. There's snow-pitch, ice hockey, sliding down the ice hill, followed by music in the evening. In February, Grand Forks celebrates Family Day weekend with free skating, swimming, skiing, ski lessons, movies, ice fishing, and more. Warm up with a steamy bowl of chili while you watch a game of curling or hockey.

SNOWMOBILING

Feel the crisp mountain air on your face as your snowmobile vibrates beneath you. Big White Ski Resort offers snowmobiling tours for enthusiasts of all ages, featuring a diverse range of trails designed to accommodate every skill level. Climb to the Paulson Summit near Christina Lake, where you can warm up in the alpine hut. Take a deep breath of fresh air and be amazed at the mountain peaks laid out before you as you ride through snow-covered fields. Explore the snowy alpine bowls to Pass Creek, east of Christina Lake.









DOWNHILL ALPINE SKIING AND SNOWBOARDING

Ride the slopes of three mountain ski areas in Boundary Country. Whether you like to tackle a challenging black diamond run, chill out on the bunny slopes, test your skills at the terrain park, or glide over a white blanket of champagne powder. Boundary's ski hills are widely varied, each with a unique winter wonderland to explore.

Head up to Big White Ski Resort, a world-class family ski resort, for a ski adventure like no other. For smaller mountains with plenty of charm, ski at Baldy Mountain Resort near Rock Creek or Phoenix Mountain Ski Area outside Grand Forks.

- Big White Ski Resort is Canada's largest ski-in, ski-out resort. The mountain has 119 runs, 16 lifts, five powder bowls, 750cm (25 feet) of snow annually, and the largest night skiing area in Western Canada. Big White is consistently voted as one of the top ski resorts in the world. The resort has all kinds of winter fun, including dog sled tours, ice skating, tubing, Nordic Skiing, horse-drawn sleigh rides, dining tours, snowmobile tours, snowshoe trails, and an exciting calendar of events.
- Baldy Mountain Resort ranks in the top ten of Canada's highest elevation ski resorts. This hidden gem has two chairlifts providing access to 35 alpine runs. The ski hill is closed on Tuesdays and Wednesdays, so you can ride a pile of untouched snow on Big Pow Thursdays. Journey through the woods and explore the 5 km (3 mi) of groomed trails by Nordic ski or snowshoe.
- Phoenix Mountain Ski Area is known as the "Best Little Mountain in BC". There's family-friendly terrain from off the T-bar and free night skiing with headlamps lighting up the darkness of the snowy slopes. Snap on your Nordic skis and explore the groomed trails nearby Marshall Lake Cross Country Ski Area.



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SNOWSHOEING & NORDIC SKI TRAILS

Strap on your cross-country skis or snowshoes and experience Boundary Country in a totally new way. Snow-covered trails call explorers to scenic vistas along forests, nature parks, and lakeshores. Venture out on a snowshoe trail in the evening darkness or glide along groomed cross-country ski tracks from many communities and mountains. Breathe in the crisp winter air, hearing only the sound of your steps breaking the stillness surrounding you.


- The historic rail trails can be accessed from many communities, and hamlets
- Big White Resort has 25 km (15.5 mi) of combined Nordic and wilderness trails created for cross-country skiing and snowshoeing, with dedicated pet-friendly trails
- Marshall Lake offers over 14 km (8.5 mi) of trails surrounding the Phoenix Mountain Ski Area. Along the way, look for the Dacha (hut) with postcard views of the distant mountains
- Baldy Mountain Resort has approximately 6 km (3.7 mi) of snowshoeing and cross-country skiing trails, originally created for the 1995 BC Winter Games
- Christina and Jewel Lakes have hiking trails by the lakes, perfect for your winter adventures on snowshoes or cross-country skis. Christina Lake Golf Course Top 9 has seasonally open trails for snowshoes or cross-country skiing. Snow Shoe rentals are available at Christina Lake Visitor Centre.
- Grand Forks features over 6 km (4 mi) of snowshoe and groomed Nordic ski track north of Grand Forks from North Fork Road to Fisherman Creek

ICE FISHING

Try your luck at fishing year-round in Boundary Country. Clear a skiff of snow from the lake's frozen surface and drill a slushy hole. Then set up your shack or tent and drop in your line. Just beneath the glassy ice surface are rainbow trout, brook trout, burbot, and mountain whitefish.

Some of the locals' favourite fishing spots are Jewel, Williamson, and Wilgress lakes. Check with local Visitor Centres to learn about ice fishing derbies, including the Wilgress Lake Family Day Weekend Fishing Derby.

Forgot something? Don't worry! You can loan a fishing rod from the Grand Forks Visitor centre.

MURALS AND STREET ART

Look out for snap-worthy murals and other floor-to-ceiling artwork on walls in Grand Forks, Christina Lake, Greenwood, and Rock Creek. The murals depict the outdoor adventures and history of Boundary Country, including the not to be missed 3D floor mural by Tyler Toews in the Christina Lake Welcome Centre that makes for super fun photos! Or meander through downtown Grand forks and enjoy murals by Archer Airbrushing, one of the many artists that colour the Boundary.



EXPLORATION: UNLIMITED.

Getting here is half the fun. The scenic Crowsnest Highway 3 is the main highway, traversing the Boundary Country landscape along the Canada-US border. Highway 33 is the route connecting Kelowna to Big White Road and Rock Creek. Find a route that fits your sense of adventure, as you travel from Vancouver and the Lower Mainland, Kelowna and the Okanagan, Alberta, or the US.

We are electric car-friendly with charging stations in Beaverdell, Rock Creek, Midway, Greenwood, Grand Forks, Big White Ski Resort, and Christina Lake.



GRAND FORKS

GETTING HERE

CROWSNEST HWY 3 FROM VANCOUVER


From Vancouver, travel east to Hope, then at the junction take Crowsnest HWY 3 east through the Similkameen Valley. Manning Park and China Ridge are where you can enjoy year-round activities. Cycle the Trans Canada Trail and the Kettle Valley Rail Trail from Princeton to the hamlets of Tulameen and Coalmont. Princeton is legendary for its fishing. Stop at Hedley and learn about First Nations people at the Snaza'ist Discovery Centre. Cawston/Keremeos is home to organic fruit, vegetable growers and a wine region that boasts almost 20 wineries. Travel onwards to Osoyoos, cross Route 97 and enter Boundary Country.

CALGARY TO BOUNDARY VIA CROWSNEST HIGHWAY 3

From Calgary, AB, drive south on HWY 2, then venture west on HWY 3 through the spectacular Crowsnest Pass. Witness the scene of Frank Slide, one of Canada's largest landslides. In Fernie, enjoy lift-accessed mountain biking at Fernie Alpine Resort, whitewater rafting, and endless hiking trails surrounding the town. Stop in Cranbrook to learn about the heritage and culture of the local Ktunaxa First Nation. Gaze at sculptures in Castlegar, the Sculpture Capital of Canada. Enter Boundary Country via Christina Lake, where trails and water fun await.

HWY 33 AND THE BIG WHITE ROAD TRIP FROM KELOWNA (OR NORTH)

From Route 97 in Kelowna, connect to HWY 33. Travel east on Big White Road to Big White Ski Resort - home of Okanagan champagne powder in winter and lush mountain wildflowers in summer. Return to HWY 33 and travel south to the hamlets of Carmi, Beaverdell, and Westbridge. Stop in Rock Creek, at the junction of HWYs 3 and 33, to explore the Kettle Valley Rail (KVR) Trail, part of Canada's iconic Trans Canada Trail. Dip your pan in the river for a chance to discover gold! Next, drive east on HWY 3 towards Midway, Grand Forks, and beyond to Christina Lake, or turn west for Bridesville and on to Osoyoos, at the junction of Route 97 and HWY 3. From Osoyoos, travel west on HWY 3 through the Similkameen Valley, go north on Route 97 through the Okanagan Valley, or head south to the United States.





BOUNDARY MONASHEE LOOP FROM OSOYOOS

The drive from Osoyoos to Christina Lake is approximately 146 km (90.7 mi) through rolling farmland, as the Kettle and Granby Rivers wind through the region before converging in Grand Forks. From Osoyoos, take Crowsnest HWY 3 east to Boundary Country, stopping at Baldy Mountain Resort, Bridesville, and arriving in Rock Creek. Pan for gold in the Kettle River. Start a hiking or biking adventure on the Trans Canada Trail and visit Mile 0 of the Kettle Valley Railway in Midway. Explore the ghostly remnants of the copper mining town Phoenix. Visit Canada's smallest city in Greenwood. Learn about Doukhobors at the Boundary Museum in Grand Forks or make the most of the warmest tree-lined lake in Canada, Christina Lake. There is no shortage of scenic viewpoints as you continue north, where Highway 3 connects with Highway 6 near Nakusp. It's there that you can explore the Valley of Hot Springs in the Arrow Lakes region before taking the Needles Cable Ferry from Fauquier across Lower Arrow Lake. In the Kootenays, soak your cares away in the revitalising, natural mineral hot springs. From there, continue westbound 135 km (84 mi) toward the North Okanagan city of Vernon, south of Kelowna. From Kelowna, travel east along HWY 33 to Big White Ski Resort, south to Beaverdell, through Westbridge, Rock Creek and Bridesville on your way back to Osoyoos.

BOUNDARY MONASHEE LOOP FROM REVELSTOKE

From Alberta, take HWY 1 to Revelstoke to access the Boundary Monashee Loop. Drive south on HWY 23 to Nakusp and enjoy the hot springs before you connect with HWY 6 south. Cruise the windy mountain roads through the Kootenays to connect with HWY 3 at Castlegar where you'll travel west to Christina Lake. From there it's a short drive to all that Boundary Country has to offer.

Once you've enjoyed Boundary Country, travel west on HWY 3 to Route 97, then travel north to Vernon where you can take HWY 6 east to Nakusp and return to HWY 1 near Revelstoke.

FROM THE USA

There are several ways to arrive in Boundary Country from North Central Washington State. Check online for border crossing times.

- 1. Cross into Canada at the Nighthawk or Oroville/Osoyoos border crossing and drive east on HWY 3 to Boundary Country.
- 2. Enter through one of the smaller border crossings off Route 97 at Tonasket (to HWY 20) or Oroville (to Chesaw Road) WA. Travel through lush ranchlands and countrysides, through ghost towns and picturesque communities. Cross over into Boundary Country at Ferry/Midway crossing on US 501 or the Danville/Carson (US 21) crossing near Grand Forks.
- 3. From the Spokane, WA area, cross over near Christina Lake at the Laurier/Cascade border crossing via HWY 395.




